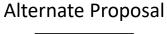

### Compensation and Rates

  - Annual index adjustment

  - Cost-based review for change in law/scope
- City Reimbursements
  - Franchise fee: Historically @ 7.5% of Gross Receipts
  - AB 939/SB 1383 fee: 2% of Gross Receipts
  - Storm water fee: set by City, not subject to franchise fee
